The introduction of the General Data Protection Regulations by the EU entails a radical shift in the way companies approach data privacy. Introduced in the Official Journal of the EU in April 2016, EU 2016/679, 'on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data', is concerned with protecting the rights of natural persons in relation to the processing of their personal data.

For companies, this may mean a cultural shift to ensure everyone is aware of data privacy. This may also require process changes to meet the regulation requirements.
